- Range of rewards for behaviour both for individuals and groups/classes.





How we assess






Year 4 = Stage 4...

- We access against 'age related' skills, set out by the Government.
- We have already done some testing this week so there is a bench mark for us to use.
- We assess your child in many ways. It provides us with valuable information to analyse and review achievements and progress in learning against age related expected standards. Furthermore it allows to plan tailored lessons for all children.

Times tables test

- Each child will be formally assessed on their times tables in year 4 in the summer term.
- This is a published SATs Government test in the summer term.




'The Year Ahead' documents .


