

## <u>Times Tables</u>

By year 4, all pupils are required to know their times tables up to and including 12x12. These should be able to be recalled quickly and out of their order. The corresponding divisions should also be known. Please work with your child to help them achieve this level of fluency which will make all of their understanding in maths easier for them.

#### Polite reminder:

You are responsible for your child's mobile phone and the messages they send and what they are able to read. Arguments and comments posted out of school across mobile phones often end up hugely affecting the school day and the ability of pupils to focus and remain positive during lessons.

Individual and sibling photos - 18<sup>th</sup> September


Junior Citizenship- (Twickenham) – 25th September (pm-we might be a bit late back- 3.45pm)

### **PPG- Pupil Premium Grant**

Parents/carers are eligible for it if:

- 1. pupils are registered for free school meals
- 2. have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years
- 3. are or have been in care
- 4. parents are in the armed forces

Benefits of the funding-it helps provide any extra support for the children so they can fulfil their full potential. We can also help fund school trips, residential trips, after school clubs and music lessons for those children.

Children will not know they receive the grant- it's confidential amongst the adults who need to know.
